

FIVE HOTELS THAT WILL HAUNT YOU

1886 CRESCENT HOTEL AND SPA EUREKA SPRINGS, ARK. This hotel-turned-hospitalturned-hotel (pictured) harbors so many restless spirits — including an Irish stonemason and a cat - itoffers nightly ghost tours. Ghost hunters say they captured a (rare) full-bodied apparition on camera here; guests post pictures of ghostly images in the "ghost book."

QUEEN MARY LONG BEACH, CALIF. This storied oceanliner (now a floating hotel) has been named one of the most haunted places in the country, and they play it up with frequent paranormal tours. Those who refuse to disembark include a sailor who was crushed to death in an engine room, a mysterious woman in white, and children who drowned in the ship's swimming pool (still frolicking in a pool no longer filled).

GETTYSBURG HOTEL GETTYSBURG, PA. Guests at this 1797 hotel report encounters with Rachel, a Civil War nurse who lived here during the Battle of Gettysburg. She's reported to rifle through drawers and leaves a cold breeze in her wake.

PLACE KNOWN FOR ITS SPIRIT



There's a lot to like about the Green Mountain Inn in picturesque Stowe, Vt. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the warm and inviting inn has more than 100 comfortable rooms filled with antiques, and two popular on-site restaurants. So it's no surprise that Boots Berry doesn't want to leave. Boots was born in 1840 in Room 302 in the thirdfloor servants' quarters, and grew up to be the inn's horseman. He was a local hero, lauded for stopping a runaway stagecoach, before he started drinking, got fired, and left town. He returned in 1902, when he saved a girl who was stranded on the inn's roof during a snowstorm, before slipping to his own death. NO FEAR OF SALEM BY SEA



Less than 20 miles northeast of Boston and four years older is the historic city of Salem. Best known as the place where, in 1692, twenty innocent victims were hanged and stoned to death as witches, Salem flourished during the 17th and 18th centuries as its merchant vessels circled the globe, bringing home great wealth. Arriving by boat is still the best way to visit Salem, especially during October, when parking lots overflow with Haunted House traffic. The Salem ferry from Long Wharf runs through Halloween. Grab a seat, smell the salty air, see the seaside estates of Marblehead, and 45 minutes later you arrive in Salem, stressfree. Your only worry is what costume to wear. GUIDED TOURS OF MAINE'S FOLIAGE Explore Maine's state parks and public reserved lands during foliage season with local park rangers. Free guided tours run through late October, when foliage is expected to peak. Rangers will answer your questions on anything from why leaves change colors to what triggers leaf drop, for instance. The moderate summer weather, recent temperature drops, and waning daylight are expected to create one of the most vibrant foliage seasons in recent years, according to the Maine Forest Service. AIRLINE REFUNDS Next time you book flights to, from, or in Europe, check with refund.me to see which airports rank at the top and bottom of the list for on-time perfor-

mance, delays, and cancellations

Should anything go awry on your adventure, due to flight delays, cancellations, and missed connections, the international service provider can help enforce your

compensation claims. To date, refund.me has processed claims from 95 countries, involving 189 airlines and 340 airports. Use the company's website or mobile app to file a claim for up to about \$812. According to refund.me, the top 10 airports for delays include Gatwick and Manchester in Britain, Frankfurt, and Orlando, while Heathrow in Britain, Munich, and Barcelona ranked in the top 10 for flight cancellations. Refund.me also helps bus, ship, and rail passengers file claims for reimbursement. www.refund.me

OFFER FEATURES AND COMFORT Parrot Zik wireless noise-canceling headphones offer the best quality, richest sound (think concert hall effect), and most comfortable fit of the many over-the-ear headphones I have tried. The Philippe Starck-designed headphones connect to your devices via Bluetooth and even let you answer cellphone calls on the go. The headphones pause music when you remove them from your ears, and restart once they are back on. Even better, lightly swipe the sensitive touch panel on the

right earpiece, and you can quickly

TAKE TRAVEL PICS

WITH A PEN CAMERA Swann's HD PenCam is a ballpoint pen with a built-in camera that takes photos and videos on the fly. The clever, easy-to-use device has a working pen, and a tiny camera that captures highdefinition AVI videos (1280 x 720 pixels) and 2-megapixel JPEG images. Flip between camera and video mode using a hidden switch, and charge the device's lithium-ion battery using the USB connector. The PenCam works with a MicroSD card up to 16GB, and can capture approximately eight hours of video or 72,000 images. The battery lasts about 45 minutes on a full charge.
