SUNDAY MORNING


ONE-OF-A-KIND VILLAGE

Pretty Hampstead Village, just a few miles from bustling downtown London, is where a small group of visitors meet for the Sunday morning tour. The setting, a pristine, preserved Georgian village set atop a verdant hill, is glorious. The group strolls the historic Heath, taking in striking views of the London skyline from Parliament Hill, while they learn of the village's colorful past. Sigmund Freud, John Keats, Agatha Christie, and Walter Gropius, among others, have lived here, contributing to the town's reputation as an artistic and intellectual hub. Today, Hampstead is home to some of the richest real estate in the United Kingdom.

The guide regales the group with tales of days past and present as they meander cobblestoned streets lined with old world cottages, country pubs, and one-of-a-kind shops. At the end of the tour, some go on to visit the Freud Museum, where you can see his famous couch, or to the Keats House Museum, where the famous poet lived from 1818 to 1820, and wrote "Ode to a Nightingale." Others grab a pint of local ale at the 16th-century Spaniards Inn, one of London's oldest pubs, toasting to a fine beginning to the day.

YO-HO-HO: UNCORK A WATERFRONT RUMBA

Sorry, you fans of "Dancing With the Stars." RumBa at the InterContinental Boston hotel has nothing to do with Latin dance. The name refers to the way Bostonians pronounce "rum bar," with a nod to the local rum trade. Hah. But that's where the cutesy stuff ends. This recently-expanded rumand-champagne lounge is a swanky space with excellent mixologists who know their way around a bottle of rum. The bar boasts a collection of nearly 100 distilled rums, many of which find their way into RumBa's signature rum cocktails, like the RumBa Mama (dark rum, coconut rum, coffee liquor, fresh lemon juice, pineapple juice, and grenadine).

PEDAL ACROSS THE PINE TREE STATE

Start preparing for a 400-mile group bike ride across Maine this September. BikeMaine, run by the 5,000-member Bicycle Coalition of Maine, takes place for the first time Sept. 7-14. Up to 350 riders will bike 60 to 75 miles a day, as they complete a circular loop from Orono that rolls through Dover-Foxcroft, Belfast, Castine, Bar Harbor, and Ellsworth. Riders will camp in less-visited rural communities and dine on local cuisine along the way. Price: \$875
