

"Silent Spring" author Rachel Carson spent significant time studying nature on the North Carolina coast; a



Those are a few of the discoveries author Georgann Eubanks unearths in "Literary Trails of Eastern North Carolina: A Guidebook" (UNC Press, \$22), the final installment in the statewide trilogy. More than 250 other novelists, journalists, poets, and playwrights, living and deceased, are examined by Eubanks, who shares their stories and passages of their work while leading readers on 18 driving tours, starting from Raleigh and including farming communities, river country, and coastal towns

INHERITING MILES

Do the rules and regulations associated with frequent flier miles leave you confused? Airfarewatchdog, an airline deal and money-saving tip website, has released an updated chart on US airlines' policies regarding inheriting and transferring miles before they expire (http://www.air farewatchdog.com/blog/155001 36/inheriting-frequent-flyermiles/). The chart makes it easy to compare what each website says, what a call to the service center revealed, the cost to transfer miles among the living, and the documentation needed to process a deceased's account. Though many airlines issue blanket statements in their rules that miles are not transferable, many do allow miles to be inherited. Airlines on this list include Alaska, American, Delta, JetBlue, Southwest, United, and US Airways.

CYCLE VERMONT'S DIRT ROADS AND ROLLING HILLS

Grab your road, cyclocross, or mountain bike and tackle 60 miles of Vermont's rolling and remote Northeast Kingdom during the Dirty 40 Race, Aug. 31. This unofficial grass-roots race, run by a couple of passionate local cyclists, cuts through rural, undeveloped landscape; passes historic homes, small working farms, and impressive estates; and covers 40 miles of dirt roads en route. Climb a total of 2,490 feet as you make your way through Derby, Holland, Morgan, Charleston, Brownington, and Newport with 499 other participants, max. The event promotes cycling and all things Vermont, and your entire \$25 entry fee supports the Mary Wright Halo Foundation, a nonprofit organization that assists local cancer patients. www.dirty40 race.com

GOOGLE MAPS SHOWCASES HAWAII'S HIKING TRAILS

Next time you go hiking in Hawaii, first check out Google Maps to see 360-degree images of the Big Island's trails and surrounding scenery. Google Maps has teamed with the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau for a first-of-its-kind partnership that lets local volunteers help capture and convey the area's beauty by recording images with Google's state-of-the-art Street View Trekker. The 40-pound contraption will grab 360-degree snapshots (tagged with GPS coordinates) of the island's popular trails, from rain forests and beaches to paths of hardened lava rock. The new Trekker loan pilot program recently started on the Big Island, but will eventually move to Kauai, Oahu, Maui, Lanai, and Molokai. GET LIVE SHOTS OF YOUR HOME WHILE AWAY
