"Watercolors": Watercolors tend to get looked down on in the hierarchy of art as being too tame, slightly insipid, or even kids' stuff. This Tate Britain overview of the medium shows just how limited and wrongheaded such a view is. The largest museum exhibition ever devoted to the use of watercolor, it takes in 800 years of art history and 250 works. Items include not only paintings but also maps, manuscripts, and botanical illustrations. Among the artists are such traditional masters of the medium as J.M.W. This extensive exhibition at the Musée du quai Branly comprises more than 330 objects from the 10th century to the present. 
