GOTA, Faroe Islands **G! Festival:** These remote islands are not the most summer-like location for a summer music festival; temperatures usually stay in the 50s and rain is more common than sun out in that part of the Kingdom of Denmark, halfway between Iceland and Norway. But G! gives an opportunity to sample local island talent (Brandur, Lyon, Eivor), plus other Northern European acts from Denmark (Nephew, Lucy Love) and Sweden (Arch Enemy, Moto Boy). Passes for the weekend are \$180. Camping on site is available for an additional \$50. Travel packages from Europe

JULY 15-18 BERN, Switzerland

Gurtenfestival: Set on a scenic Swiss hilltop, this year's fest features everyone from 1990s modern rock stalwarts Faith No More to world music darlings Rodrigo and Gabriela. Other acts include the Kooks, Groove Armada, Stereophonics, John Butler Trio, Bad Religion, Editors, Gossip, Jet, and the Cribs. In the middle of all this rock, Gurtenfestival emphasizes dance music

JULY 23-25 Capitol Hill Block Party: This

party is a distinct change of pace from the usual summer music festival. There's no nature, no camping, and ticket prices are ridiculously inexpensive (\$23 for single day, advance tickets). Headliners include MGMT, Blonde Redhead, !!!, Atmosphere, The Deadweather, and

JULY 8-18 OUEBEC CITY

Festival d'été de Québec: The emphasis of this massive cultural festival may be the province's French roots (this year there are appearances from French television personality Daniela Lumroso, and local crooner Gilles Vigneault), but there are Canadian acts with little French connection also performing, such as the Arcade Fire, Rush, and Iron

Maiden. Then there are acts with limited ties to the city, such as the Black Eyed Peas, German industrial rockers Rammstein, and former Supertramp lead singer Roger Hodgson. Tickets for shows are available individually; a pass for access to all outdoor shows is \$50. Hotel and ticket packages available. infofestival


